



The Current State of U.S. Patent Litigation: Have We Reached the Bottom Yet?


Major Law Changes Impacting Patent Litigation

- eBay (2006) made it considerably more difficult to obtain an injunction
- AIA (2011) introduced post-grant challenge proceedings with lower standard of proof than in court, and amended joinder rules to limit joinder
- Mayo (2012)/Alice (2014) raised bar for patent eligibility
- Nautilus (2014) raised the bar for claim definiteness / clarity
- Octane Fitness/Highmark (2014) lowered the bar for fee shifting
- FRCP amendment (2015) eliminated Form 18 allowing generalized pleading
- TC Heartland (2017) limited venue for patent infringement cases






Patent Case Filings 2010-2019 U.S. District Court






High-Volume Plaintiffs' Case Filings 2010-2019 U.S. District Court






AIA Petitions 2012 to 2019






Parties to New Patent Cases U.S. District Court, PTAB and ITC






Patent Accusations in New Patent Cases U.S. District Court, PTAB and ITC






New Docket Entries in Patent Cases U.S. District Court, PTAB and ITC






Motions to Stay U.S. District Court Pending IPR – 2017-2019

Motion to Stay Pending Inter Partes Review






The PTAB's Rate of Institution Has Decreased





Patent Case Filings to 2019 excluding High-Volume Plaintiff, ANDA, and MDL Associated Cases













U.S. District Court Outcomes – 2016 to 2019






U.S. District Court 101 Challenges – 2016 to 2019





ITC Outcomes—2016 to 2019








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
One Year Before TC Heartland


Figure 11: Districts with the Most New Patent Cases in 2019




